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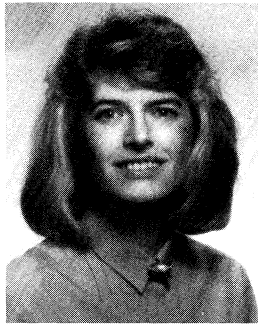

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## Introduction

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*HELP for Word Finding* represents the second volume in the *HELP for . . .* product series. Although specific word-finding skills are addressed in *HELP 2, HELP for Word Finding* was written in response to requests from educators and clinicians for more varied material within this area of language processing. *HELP for Word Finding* focuses exclusively on word-finding tasks designed to enhance not only the speed of word recall, but also the quality and variety of the words retrieved. *HELP for Word Finding* also enables a natural expansion of vocabulary within functional, everyday contexts.

The development of word-finding skills is essential to our ability to give meaning to our world, to develop functional semantics and syntax, and to effectively communicate with one another. This volume emphasizes six major areas involving word-retrieval skills — automatic associations, themes, definitions, answering questions, parts of speech, and using context.

Using stimulus items progressing in difficulty whenever possible within each task, *HELP for Word Finding* targets the six-year-old to adult population. Given the flexibility of the tasks and the stimulus items within those tasks, *HELP for Word Finding* can be used with individuals with language impairment, traumatic brain injury, and language deficits due to stroke, ranging from school age to adolescence to adult.

IEP goals are provided at the bottom of each page to clarify the task direction and to aid the busy professional in generating appropriate goals. Word-finding activities to augment individual therapy sessions and to provide suggestions for integrated therapy in classrooms or small group settings can be found on pages 167–169.

The following guidelines are offered for effective use of the tasks in *HELP for Word Finding*:

1. Most of the tasks in this volume can be used as auditory tasks, written tasks, or both. Blanks are provided for written responses. Use your own judgment to determine if a task should be presented orally or in writing. Depending on the age and the ability of the client, oral presentation may be followed up with written worksheets for review at home.
2. Every effort has been made to order each task from the easiest to the most difficult items; however, experiences vary as well as the overall skills of clients, so use your own judgment in choosing which portions of each section are appropriate for an individual client.
3. Many repetitions as well as varying amounts of cueing may be necessary to facilitate recall and internalization of the concepts. Keep track of accuracy rates to assess client performance and to determine when a change in difficulty or task is indicated.

4. Common, correct responses have been provided and are located in the answer key at the end of the book. As experiences vary, responses other than those listed may be appropriate. Again, use your discretion in logging client accuracy.
5. Focus on achieving carryover of concepts to everyday situations and conversations by questioning, repeating, and emphasizing specific concepts within contexts outside the therapy environment. These exercises may be successfully used by parents, other family members, and paraprofessionals with some guidance from the clinician. For carryover to be effective, communication between home and school or clinic is essential. Functional outcomes from the use of the *HELP* approach can only be realized if skills are generalized to a variety of communication environments.

In this volume, we have attempted to incorporate a variety of tasks that are interesting, informative, and, at the same time, challenging. Efforts have also been made to use as many practical, functional daily life skills and experiences as possible while approaching standard therapy targets. Current therapy trends emphasizing instruction within context are reflected in the Using Context section, pages 149–166.

As with our previous *HELP* products, we and LinguiSystems have attempted to respond to your growing needs as educators and clinicians, and to incorporate as many of your suggestions as possible. We hope you find *HELP for Word Finding* a valuable addition to the professional resources that address the communication needs of your clients.

Next, ask “what, who,” or “which” questions about each of the objects or pictures. For example, “Which one helps us when we’re lost?” Then, ask your client to touch the appropriate object or picture or to name it, depending on his skill level.
5. List five to eight numerals on a chalkboard or lap board. Then, ask questions which the client can answer by pointing to the appropriate numeral. For example, write 13, 3, 1, 12, and 14 in a line or scattered on the board. Then, ask questions, like “Which one means first?” and “Which one is believed to be unlucky?” Items from the Number Association section in Automatic Associations on pages 28–29 can be used to generate numeral combinations. Vary the difficulty level of items and the number of choices depending on your client’s ability level.
6. Give your clients a choice of two or three themes, like grocery store, farm, and playground. Then, read several items from one of those particular sections in Themes, pages 40–54. Ask your client to guess which theme you were discussing.

7. Name an item or concept within a particular theme and ask your client to make up a clue that would help someone think of that answer. Write all the clues together on a page and make a theme book for that client.
8. Have a scavenger hunt. Hide items around the room or yard. Give your clients clues for the hidden items to tell them what they're looking for. For children, have a contest to see who can find the most items.
9. Use common household products, like detergent, furniture polish, and soap, and have your client make up commercials or ads to sell each product. You might want to review specific attributes of the products to help your client generate appropriate ads. Or, place products or pictures in front of your client and ask him to point to the one described in an ad you read aloud. Another activity might be to read two or three ads for the same product and have your client choose the one that best describes the product.
10. Write words from different word classes, like nouns, verbs, and adjectives on index cards, using a different colored marker for each word class. Then, provide your client with printed sentences that have one or more words omitted. Use the same color ink as you used to write each word class to draw in blanks for the missing words. These color cues will help your client complete the blanks. For example, if the nouns are written in red and there's a red blank in a sentence, your client will know to choose a card from the red stack to fill in the blank. Have your client read each sentence aloud as it's completed.
11. Play a variation of Twenty Questions. Place an object or a picture card in a bag. Have one person look at the picture or object while the others ask questions to figure out what the object is. For example, "Is it round?" and "Does it have holes in it?" Make the activity easier by providing the category of the object or picture before the questions are asked. For example, "This object is a tool." Make the activity more difficult by limiting the number of each type of question each player may ask, like "no more than five 'does' questions."
12. For younger children, help them build personal word banks using index cards with pictures of common people, places, and things on each. Provide your clients with several boxes, each labeled with a question word, like *who*, *what*, *when*, and *where*. Give your client a catalog or magazine and help her look for favorite pictures that represent each class. Cut out these pictures and glue them on cards, filing them in the appropriate boxes. During each session, review the words in the boxes and add others. After your client is familiar with all the word cards, ask her to generate questions for each card in the box. For example, "What animal has a long neck?" for a picture of a giraffe from the "what" box.
13. Place a picture or a word at the top of a sheet of paper. Down the left margin, write question clues to help your client generate a description of the object. For example, if *ladder* is at the top of the paper, use questions like, "What is it used for? Who uses it? When is it used? Where is it used? What is used with it?" and "Where is

it kept?" After the questions are answered, have your client use the answers as conversational prompts to describe the object or to complete a written description.

14. After your client has completed several descriptions of objects, persons, or events using the technique in #13, have him use two completed prompt sheets to compare and contrast two objects, persons, or events. Choose items with similarities as well as differences.
15. Print short, familiar rhymes or lines from songs on index cards, substituting synonyms for several of the key words. Read the rhyme or song aloud, and ask your client to identify the original rhyme or song. For example you might present "Rain, rain, go away. Come again another day" as "Rain, rain, leave. Return another time."
16. Help your students with word-finding problems complete class work by developing vocabulary cue sheets for written material in each content area. Include new words from a chapter or reading assignment and give it to the student prior to the time the assignment is given in class. On each sheet, include a phonetic pronunciation of each new word in the chapter, a dictionary definition of the word, a paraphrased definition of the word, a sentence from the text that includes the word, and a sentence that uses the word in a different context. After working with the new words, ask your students to highlight all the words from the cue sheets in their texts before they begin reading the assignment.
